

Our budgeted mission items include donations to: Chimacum schools, Tacoma Community House, Dove House, Christmas for children, Backpacks for Kids, Y-summer literacy program, Food Bank, World Thank Offering, and this year gifts in memory for Marilyn Linrothe, Jean Straub, and Alice Guthrie.

Our Sunshine person (AJ) sends cards to members and friends who are ill or who have had a death in the family.

During the year, we have mission projects that include making valentines for every woman in the church, assembling goodie bags for the food bank (not candy), and donating personal toiletry items for distribution at The Boiler Room.

We hosted the senior dinner for Chimacum high school 100th anniversary in May. (We've been doing this for 70+ years!) We also donated \$250 beyond our budgeted donation for school supplies for disadvantaged children at Chimacum Elementary School.

UMW provides coffee and goodies for funerals.

Our group has had many interesting speakers during the year including Guardian Ad Litem program, Nancy McDaniel and her history book, Amy Howard from The Boiler Room, learning about the safe sanctuary program, and we have attended other UMW's in the area for special programs. There is also time for caring and sharing, especially after the sandwich lunch and delicious dessert!

Some days ago I was wakened suddenly. The ground was shaking. It continued to move so violently and for so long that I got out of bed, realizing that this was an earthquake. My husband and son did the same. We had never been in a situation like this, and all we could think to do was to cover ourselves and to huddle together. We were totally helpless before the power of nature, and we were deeply aware of our human frailty. I prayed fervently, asking God for protection and strength. Once the earthquake ended, I talked to my parents and friends to find out how they were doing.

Forgetting all that we felt during those moments will be difficult. When we feel nature's power in contrast to our human weakness, all that matters is life itself and the safety of our loved ones.

On these occasions we appreciate life and realize what is truly valuable. Since that day I have tried to spend mor time with the people I love and to give God thanks for our life. Material things lose their value when we look at them through new lenses.
