#### From Our Home to Yours

Earlier this week I had a lady come by the church to drop off a Christmas card. The front of the card showed a winter scene with an outside decorated tree with several deer grazing through the snow on the ground. The front read: "From Our Home to Yours." Inside it read: "Christmas is for saving out loud what we think in our hearts all year long. You've got a special place in our lives, and we thank God for you!" It was signed Merry Christmas & Happy New Year!! Many Blessings to you all. It also contained a handwritten note on the inside cover that read: We would like to thank you and your church for all the help you do for us at Peter's Place, and was signed by several of the residents at Peter's Place which is, for those who may not know, is the tiny home village located on church property and managed by Bayside Housing and Services.

It was the perfect card, first for what it said on the outside; "From our home to yours." Yes, from their 96 square foot tiny home to our church home. And the inside referenced what was in their hearts, that we have a special place in their lives, and they thank God for us. And the inscription on the inside cover acknowledging all that we do down in our General Store on Saturday mornings where our disciples do what they can to meet their specific needs and, more importantly, treat them with genuine grace,

love, and empathy. They come to us because they feel welcome and know that we see them as human beings, as brothers and sisters of Jesus Christ, and as neighbors who we treat just like we would want to be treated if we found ourselves in a similar situation.

As a church that is truly Spirit-led, a church that strives to be the somebodies that do something in Jesus' name, this is so Biblical. If you've been paying attention at all during the past seven plus years you know one of my favorite New Testament passages is found in the 25<sup>th</sup> chapter of Matthew's Gospel. It's the one where Jesus tells his audience that when the Human One returns in his majesty and all his angels are with him, he will sit on his majestic throne. All the nations will be gathered before him and he will separate them from each other, just as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. Spoiler alert. You don't want to be a goat. Anyway, the sheep are the believers who when they saw someone who was hungry they gave them food to eat, when they saw someone who was thirsty they gave them something to drink, when they saw someone who was naked they gave them clothes to wear, when they met a stranger they welcomed him or her, when they saw someone who was sick they took care of them, and when they saw someone who was imprisoned they visited them. Jesus assured them that when they did any one of these things for the least of his brothers or sisters, they did it for him. The goats, however, were the believers who saw the

or sisters they did it for him. The goats, however, were the believers who saw the needs yet did nothing and would go away into eternal punishment while the righteous ones would go into eternal life.

And in the Apostle Paul's second letter to the church in Corinth, the nineth chapter, he talks about people cheerfully giving whatever they have out of their abundance. Giving what they have decided in their hearts without hesitation because God loves a cheerful giver. Paul assures us that if we do this God will provide us with what we need, with more than enough of every kind of grace. And, he says, that the one who does this will be made rich in every way so that he or she can be generous in every way. Such generosity, he says, produces thanksgiving to God through us. The ministry of this service to God's people isn't only fully meeting their needs but it is also multiplying in many expressions of thanksgiving to God. These people will give honor to God for your obedience to your confession of Christ's gospel. They will also pray for you, and they will care deeply for you because of the outstanding grace that God has given to you.

We are doing exactly what Jesus would have us do with all that we have been provided, and as a result these people and others are praising God and are praying for us because we care for them, no strings attached, and no questions asked, as it should be.

And that's our ministry and our mission as we go into the new year. To carry on what we have been led to do by the Holy Spirit. I can only wonder what new mission opportunities the Spirit will lead us to as we continue to grow spiritually in God's service.

### **Silent Dessert Auction**






A special thank you to the bakers and dessert makers who helped make the December Dessert Auction a huge success.


